A major flooding event occurred on January 22, 2024 in San Diego County. Through a region-wide damage self-report survey, 211, the County and City Local Assistance Centers, Emergency Temporary Intake Process, and calls, there were about **5,000 initial reports of property damage or other type of storm impact** to residential and commercial locations. Of those, **595 residential locations were classified as major damage**, **2,022 were renters**, and **2,601 were owners**.







A major flooding event occurred on January 22, 2024 in San Diego County. Through a region-wide damage self-report survey, 211, the County and City Local Assistance Centers, Emergency Temporary Intake Process, and calls, there were about **2,600 initial reports of property damage or other type of storm impact** to residential and commercial locations in the City of San Diego. Of those, **431 residential locations were classified as major damage**, **1,265 were renters**, and **1,249 were owners**. This report summarizes the status of **928** households or cases managed by Equus (County contractor) and the County in the City of San Diego.











A major flooding event occurred on January 22, 2024 in San Diego County. Through a region-wide damage self-report survey, 211, the County and City Local Assistance Centers, Emergency Temporary Intake Process, and calls, there were about 330 initial reports of property damage or other type of storm impact to residential and commercial locations in the Housing Authority of the County of San Diego (HACSD), excluding Unincorporated areas. Of those, 10 residential locations were classified as major damage, 110 were renters, and 208 were owners. This report summarizes the status of 58 households or cases managed by Equus (County contractor) and the County in the HACSD, excluding the Unincorporated areas. The HACSD is the authority for 13 municipalities in the county and the unincorporated areas.




